

Rawabi city was built upon an initiative and under the leadership of Bashar Al-Masri through a strategic partnership between Massar International and Qatar. The city is built on a strategic location north of Jerusalem in a region near Ramallah; it is located on hills overlooking the Mediterranean Sea from the west. Rawabi was constructed as part of the first integrated zoning and planning scheme of modern times, and with a modern urban vision and sustainable environmental practices on an area of 6,300,000 square meters amid a magnificent Palestinian landscape.

The first phase of Rawabi consists of 5,000 housing units, of which more than 1,000 apartments are ready to be lived in. The city will expand to 22 residential neighborhoods with a vast array of housing unit designs. In its first phase, the city will accommodate more than 25,000 people; upon completion, it will house more than 40,000 persons. The city's modern residential guarters embrace Palestinian social and cultural uniqueness and architectural heritage. The city will include vital facilities such as a modern multi-purpose mall for shopping and trade, a business ventures incubator equipped with the latest international technology to lead businesses and creative innovations, in addition to health centers and places for worship. The city launched Rawabi English Academy, to be followed in the future with a multi-resources educational and academic complex. An outdoor Roman-style amphitheater has recently hosted an audience of around 15,000 people. Exceptional entertainment facilities have been added so far, including the equestrian club, challenging high-adrenalin games, parks and green areas.

AUSTRIAN PRIME MINISTER DELIGHTED BY THE MAGNITUDE OF RAWABI

Rawabi was honored to host visiting Prime Minister of Austria, H. E. Christian Kern, who admired the professionalism and scope of Rawabi's planning, development, and infrastructure. Prime Minister Kern described the new city as a Palestinian achievement exceeding all expectations. Rawabi's enterprise-enabling ICT network and world-class utility infrastructure drew Kern's praise, who noted its potential to attract international firms and direct foreign

investment to its burgeoning Tech Hub. "I truly did not expect Rawabi to be so large; it's one of the most beautiful development projects I've ever seen in my life," Kern observed. "The Palestinian people deserve to live in dignity at a safe and well-planned city like this one," he added. Rawabi founder, Mr. Bashar Masri, welcomed the Prime Minister to Rawabi and expressed pride and gratitude on behalf of all Palestinians that the city's progress drew the attention of

The Q Center is officially open for business. Last month, dozens of enterprises launched headquarter operations at the gleaming towers of the commercial hub that overlooks the city.

Down below, sidewalks, cafes, and retail stores hummed with life as the Q Center's new residents explored Rawabi's vibrant core. These forward-looking businesses have made the move to Rawabi with an eye on the future.

In addition, the Q Center towers offer a number of recreational areas for the employees to enjoy during their breaks. Many companies used the move as an opportunity to upgrade their workforce and to purchase new equipment, both of which can be more affordably housed in the sleek new offices at the Q Center.

Employee morale is high, with many expressing delight at the conveniences and comforts of the working life in Rawabi's bustling, clean, urban environment. The successful transition of these companies to the Q Center is a critical milestone for the city of Rawabi. Employment generation has long been the city's most important objective, and now completes Rawabi's pillars of "Live, Work, Grow".

As the lights come on in the Q Center, it becomes even easier to see that the vision of Rawabi as an economic hub is very bright.



Chairman of the Board of WAFA News Agency and General Supervisor of the Palestinian Broadcasting Corporation (PBC), Ahmad Assaf, recently paid a visit to Rawabi to tour the new city and to discuss potential avenues for cooperation with Rawabi founder Bashar Masri. Assaf was accompanied by department heads from WAFA and the PBC. During their meeting, Assaf and Masri explored innovative ways to approach the media's use of Rawabi's unique infrastructure, particularly its sports and entertainment venues ideal for live event broadcasting. The city's many cultural attractions, including concerts and performances in WaDina's open-air amphitheater, are well-suited to promote artistic expression and cultural awareness at a national level. Assaf expressed

appreciation for the high-quality infrastructure and well-organized logistics frameworks that underpin the city. "I heard a great deal about Rawabi before my visit," he stated, "but the reality has completely exceeded my expectations. This city is a source of pride for the Palestinian people and a testament to their ability to thrive and create an alternative atmosphere in the midst of adverse circumstances." Assaf also praised the recently opened commercial hub of the city, the Q Center. "This is undoubtedly one of the most impressive private sector projects in the history of the country," he observed. At the conclusion of his tour, Assaf discussed the intent of the PBC to launch a project to sponsor Palestinian performers at the amphitheater, already a competitor with the largest entertainment venues in the Middle East in

terms of capacity, infrastructure, and technology. The well-designed buildings offer views from nearly every floor; ventilation and airflow have been carefully engineered to mitigate annoyances such as sound, air or light pollution. 

SMART CITIES IN FOCUS AT THE SECOND INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE FOR TEACHING AND LEARNING IN THE DIGITAL WORLD

In March, An-Najah National University's E-Learning Center in Nablus hosted the 'Second International Conference for Learning and Teaching in the Digital World / Smart Learning'. The conference, held under the patronage of Prime Minister Dr. Rami Hamdallah, aimed to raise awareness about recent global trends and best practices in this new and exciting educational arena. The conference defines Smart Learning as being "...based on reconstructing theoretical concepts in a scientific and practical way. It links information and analysis through critical thinking and scientific research. Smart learning also employs up-to-date electronic, communication and technological systems." Rawabi, home to Palestine's most extensive and technologically-advanced communications infrastructure, was discussed in depth at the conference as a premiere example of a "Smart City".

The spirit of friendly competition was "king" at the city of Rawabi during the 5-day Palestinian National Chess Championship 2017. Held in the Understage hall, the contest was sponsored by The National Bank, with in-kind support from local businesses BCI and V&V Communications.

Forty of Palestine's top players faced off in a series of matches organized in accordance with the World Chess Federation's tournament guidelines: 9 rounds and a player time limit of 90 minutes. Tied matches could be challenged directly and winners established on total points. The player lineup originally included 12 competitors from the Gaza Strip, but unfortunately they were prohibited from attending at the last minute by the Israeli government. The tournament opening ceremony was attended by Major General Jibril Rjoub, Chairman of the Palestinian Olympic Committee and Chairman of the Football Association, and Bashar Masri, Executive Member of the Palestinian Olympic Committee and Chairman of the Palestinian Chess Federation. Both men expressed pride at the skill level of the players and their equanimity under tough competitive conditions. Rioub and Masri also noted that the championship's location at Rawabi was an encouraging reminder of the ongoing progress being made within Palestinian society. Championship logistics were overseen by a joint commission with delegates from the city of Rawabi and from the

Palestinian Chess Federation. Players, referees, judges, and board members of the Palestinian Chess Federation gathered at a preliminary organizing event to review the rules and regulations of the championship. The success of the competition prompted discussions of a more active promotion of the game of chess in schools throughout Palestine. Chess Federation representatives agreed to work to strengthen ties with the Palestinian Ministry of Education to incorporate chess more prominently within the public school extracurricular activity landscape.

During his recent visit, Major General Jibril Rjoub, Chairman of the Palestinian Football Association and Chairman of the Palestinian Olympic Committee, toured Rawabi's extensive sports and recreation infrastructure.
